Ship's Logbook Found—Treasure Still Hidden

The logbook of *The Golden Rind* came to light yesterday when the wife of one of its crewmembers sorted through her husband Grayfur's papers. Captain Grayfur was lost at sea near the Ratlápagos Islands nearly 20 years ago. He and his crew had been hunting for the treasure lost by *The Golden Rind* in 1713 when the disappeared. Their ship sank in a storm.



The logbook records the last known location of *The Golden Rind*, near Cream Cheese Island. One of the largest ships of its time, bearing 36 bronze cannons, it sank during the Great Cat War.

The treasure Grayfur and his crew were seeking was 13 diamonds intended for King Charles Cheddarama IV. The last logbook entry, written on February 13, 1713, by *The Golden Rind's* captain, Admiral Don Sea Snout III, described the diamonds as being "as big as a mouse's fist." The ship sank after hitting a "claw-shaped rock," according to Adm. Sea Snout.

No one since has been able to locate the sunken ship or its precious cargo.
